CITY COUNCIL UPDATE REPORT
October 15, 2019

SH 146 Expansion

Staff will be meeting next week for the monthly update with the contractors and TxDOT to receive latest updates. The Office of Community Relations has revised the SH146.com website to include a new calendar feature. It is the goal to give the public a better format for closures that are reported on the project and their duration.

Phase II – The second phase of the project is still anticipated to begin in November 2019. In this phase, expansion of the southbound side of the existing bridge is anticipated. If this phase begins next month, the current centerline south of NASA Parkway could be shifted to the east. The contractor is working with TxDOT to have the requested delineators installed or if this phase progresses, concrete barriers or barrels will be installed.

Capital Improvement Projects (CIP)

Pine Gully WWTP Ph. 1A (CIP Number WW9)

FEMA and TDEM requested a revised Request for Information (RFI). On October 11, 2019, Jeff Galyean, Director of Emergency Management and Cobb Fendley finished compiling the requested information and it was electronically submitted.

SH 146 City Utility Relocates (CIP W7 and WW8)

Public Works and contract inspector continue to closely monitor utility relocations project with the contractor for the SH 146 Expansion. This past week the water line casing bore began at Main Street and SH 146.

Marvin Circle Paving and Waterline Improvements (CIP S10)

Engineering consultant and staff continue to work on outstanding quality control issues. Three panels at this job site had to be removed and re-poured. Staff will work with lab and anticipate remainder of the work to continue for curb and gutter.

2019 Waterline Improvements – Pine Gully and Hester Gully crossings (CIP W17 and W18)

Hester Gully Water Line bore complete and project is in final stage for withdrawal on that site. The Pine Gully water line is undergoing testing and should begin finish work in the following week.

Red Bluff Roadway Expansion Project

Staff is working on an Amendment to the Advanced Funding Agreement with final numbers from bid. This amendment will be presented back to City Council for approval in November. A kick off meeting date is still pending.
